He gives to His beloved sleep.....

I trust that your summer is going well, hopefully with your schedules becoming less hectic and your "load" a bit lightened. God did not create us to be going 24/7, 365 ¼ days a year. This means rest (and worship) every Sabbath and time for recreation (or, better yet, "re-creation"!!!) at various seasons of the year. Such rest and re-creation is good for the family and good for the soul. Not only is rest commanded by God, it is a gift from God. As Psalm 127:2 reminds weary sojourners: "It is in vain that you rise up early and go late to rest, eating the bread of anxious toil; for He (God) gives to his beloved sleep."

For this reason, I am concerned by recent reports that an increasing number of American workers are not taking some (or any) of their earned vacation. What the English poet and author, George MacDonald, wrote over a hundred years ago is still applicable today: "Work is not always required of man. There is such a thing as sacred idleness, the cultivation of which is now fearfully neglected." No doubt, the reasons for this are varied: perhaps there are those who cannot afford it financially; or, perhaps, others have the mistaken notion that things at the office just can't go on without them; or any number of other such excuses we tell ourselves.

Clearly with Psalm 127 in mind, Charles Peguy writes a poem entitled, "Sleep." In the poem we hear God speak:

Sleep is perhaps the most beautiful thing I have created.

And I myself rested on the seventh day....

Poor people, they don't know what is good.

They look after their business very well

during the day.

But they haven't enough confidence in me

to let me look after it during the night.

As if I wasn't capable of looking

after it during one night.....

And I say Blessed, blessed is the man

who puts off what he has to

do until tomorrow.

Blessed is he who puts off.

That is to say, Blessed is he who hopes.

And who sleeps.

God bless all of you in your rest and re-creation this summer. Take the time to enjoy your family, friends and loved ones; and take the time to nurture your faith.



Brandon and Nevaeh work with Erica, an LSI Family Support Worker in our Early Childhood department. "The home-visits with Erica have been extremely beneficial," expressed Brandon.
